Studies of family carers have focused on the stressors that they face and also on the perceived resources that enable them to cope with the stressors. However, no studies have been reported about the experience of the carers, in particular, how carers experience the emotional impact of their situation. The aim of this study was to describe how family carers of children with cancer in Hong Kong experience their situation. A qualitative exploratory descriptive design was used. A purposive sampling strategy was used to recruit 30 family carers of children with cancer from the Oncology Day Care Centre in Hong Kong. A semi-structured interview approach was used to collect the data. The data were analysed using Colaizzi's phenomenological approach. The major themes were: 'communicative of the condition' and 'communicative of the situation'. The carers' experiences were compounded by the family's experience of the disease and the social support available. Communicative methods of information were used to enable carers to communicate with the children. Being away from the children and being separated from their social support network presented a major emotional burden. The experience of carers is complex. The carers' experience of their situation cannot be reduced to a single dimension.
